Project Updates

Philanthropy and Campus Life

For philanthropy, this year I was able to secure over \$350,000 in fundraising and university investment toward three key priorities: basic needs, campus safety, and Greek life programming. This included support for the ASI Food Pantry, the Basic Needs Resource Center, and funding to offer free meal cards to students. We also secured \$100,000 for campus safety, including funding for free self-defense classes. In addition, funding was secured to support programming for Greek organizations. This year also marked important progress for Greek life, including the Greek-affiliated housing planning, as well as the inauguration of the annual Greek photo in the Quad.

This semester, our self-defense classes had over 70 attendees and were offered in partnership with key stakeholders, including the Student Alumni Association, the Women's Resource Center, Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Incorporated, and Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated. Alongside physical self-defense, the sessions also included psychological preparedness. In addition, Yes Means Yes training was provided to Greek organizations, and the survey was developed in collaboration with Inclusive Excellence.
