A Special Note to Our Hornets

- 1. The Division of IE is pleased to communicate positive feedback from last month's Antisemitism Hate Symbols & Language Town Hall. As a reminder, members of the Sacramento State faculty and Sacramento City community leaders met to increase communal awareness, engage in collective healing, and to begin developing opportunities for collaborative action. Plans for future action have been developed and are currently in review for approval.
- 2. The Office for Cultural Transformation, in partnership with Dr. Rose Borunda, are planning to pilot Bridging & Belonging Communities for faculty and staff in January. These communities will be focused on learning and unpacking complex topics around a range of racial and social justice issues happening both nationally and on campus.
- 3. Diversity Hiring Fellows program participants continue to meet to focus on developing and applying inclusive hiring practices for faculty searches. The goal of the fellowship program is to train diversity hiring ambassadors that will meet with search committees at various times along the search process to ensure a DEI lens grounds the approach to identifying new faculty hires.
- 4. New Faculty Orientation planning and support: The Office for Cultural Transformation supported the Office of Faculty Advancement in planning New Faculty Orientation. The



goal was to embed DEIBJ focused content and co-develop a plan for future Employee Affinity Group sessions. Two orientation sessions were drafted. One session focused on navigating difficult conversations in the classroom and another one on fostering inclusivity, accessibility and belonging in the college classroom.

The office aims to meet units, departments, and colleges in their current cultural state and guide these microclimates as they self-identify strengths, weaknesses, opportunities for improvement, and barriers that may be impeding their progress toward meeting the Antiracism & Inclusive Campus Plan goals & objectives. DEI and cultural transformation consultations are ongoing.

Spark interest and ignite awareness for solving existing equity issues and DEI dilemmas on campus. Become a campus changemaker in 5 min. & 5 slides by offering strategies, actions, policy changes, etc. that faculty, staff, and students might immediately use to enhance the classroom and campus experience for all.

Green and Gold Speaker Series: Tribal Justice

The G&G speaker event took place from noon-1 p.m. on Tuesday, Nov. 15. Chief Tribal Judges Abby Abinanti and Victorio Shaw helped to provide communal awareness around concepts such as tribal sovereignty, joint jurisdictional jurisprudence, and their humancentered approach to justice for individuals, communities, families, and youth. The recording of this virtual panel discussion, moderated by Sac State Native American Studies faculty, will be made available soon and will remain available on the Green & <u>Gold Speaker Series Website</u> for all Sac State community members. Sac State <u>Beyond J podcast</u> extends the impact of the University beyond J Street — transforming the Sacramento Region by uplifting the voices of students and other campus groups. - <u>I'm a Recovering Racist</u> This thoughtful conversation, featuring Sacramento Poet Laureate Andru Defeye, focuses on the difference between prejudice and racism, systemic power and control, privilege and equity, and reveals some uncomfortable truths but is ultimately about hope.



 <u>Escaping Ukraine</u> - Two Sac State grads—one visiting Ukraine and one at home in Sacramento— share their experiences following the Russian invasion of Ukraine.
