Internal Committee Updates

ASI Greek Life Committee

- Advanced ASI collaboration with Greek Life councils and SO&L, contributing **\$500 in Strategic Priority funding** to support Greek Life programming, alongside a **\$150,000 investment from the President's Office** to further strengthen student engagement and organizational development (SP 3, SP 4).
- Institutionalized stronger partnership between ASI and Greek Life through consistent coordination, shared programming, and increased visibility of leadership opportunities across councils.

ASI International Students Committee

- Continued advancing efforts to elevate international student voice and visibility within ASI, with a focus on improving communication, access to resources, and overall student experience (SP 5).
- Supported ongoing conversations around international student needs, including retention, affordability, and institutional awareness, reinforcing ASI's commitment to inclusive and globally minded student support (SP 3, SP 5).

ASI Student Social Justice & Equity Council

- Strengthened alignment between ASI and equity-centered campus partners, reinforcing a shared commitment to accessibility, representation, and inclusive student engagement (SP 3, SP 5).
- Helped position SSJEC as a collaborative space for advancing student advocacy, including continued coordination with the Disability Access Center (DAC) and Disability Justice Club (DJC) to support awareness and resource accessibility initiatives (SP 3, SP 5).

California State Student Association (CSSA)

CSSA May 2026 Plenary

- Attended the final California State Student Association (CSSA) Plenary of the academic year, hosted at California State University San Marcos, representing Sacramento State within the Systemwide Affairs Committee.
- Engaged in key policy discussions, including action items on CSU executive compensation and reforms to the CSU alternative consultation process, as well as consultation on the Strategic Enrollment Management framework presented by the Chancellor's Office.
- Recognized Sacramento State President Luke Wood, recipient of the Robert C. Maxson President of the Year Award at the CSSA Celebration of Excellence Awards, highlighting the university's continued leadership and impact across the CSU system.
- Concluded CSSA participation for the academic year, reinforcing Sacramento State's continued presence in statewide advocacy efforts focused on affordability, governance, and student success.
