Internal Committee Accomplishments

Green Team

Purpose: The committee will advise the University of source reduction, recycling, and other environmental activities.

-The chair (Kathryn) did a great job this year with the committee. We were able to put on different events including a movie night and an environmental justice panel. We also had great speakers come to our meetings to speak on their involvement with sustainability.

Student Marketing and Outreach Committee

Purpose: The Student Marketing & Outreach Committee is responsible for producing and executing a student relations campaign through marketing research and promotions each semester, and when the ASI Board of Directors or the Student Marketing and Outreach deems necessary. At least one student relations campaign must be held in the fall semester and reported to the ASI Board of Directors and to the ASI Marketing Committee by the third week of the spring semester.

-I chaired the Student Marketing and Outreach Committee in the Spring when I took over as EVP. I decided to continue with what the committee was working on in the fall. We continued with making our survey around productivity and social connections. We received over onhundred responses and reported the results the ASI Board of Directors. From this we also put on event in collaboration with the Sacramento State Library, called "Virtual Social & Study Hour", to allow students to make social connections and be productive.

Lobby Corps

Purpose: The Sac State Lobby Corps is the advocacy branch of ASI and serves as a policy analysis and advisory committee to the ASI Board of Directors. It is comprised of Sacramento State students who lobby at the local, state, and federal levels.

-The committee was able to discuss many pieces of legislation that impact higher education and take stances on them.

Student Academic Senate

Purpose: The Student Academic Senate shall serve in an advisory capacity to the Board of Directors pertaining to matters within the Faculty Senate and Academic Affairs that directly affects students.

-I chaired the Student Academic Senate during the fall. At every meeting we went over the Faculty Senate agendas and went over academic issues that our students are facing.



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University Committee Accomplishments

Faculty Senate

Purpose: The Faculty Senate serves to be the primary consultive body for instructional and academically related professional matters on campus.

While this is a faculty-based committee, there are three non-voting student seats. As a student on the committee, my job was to be the student voice on issues and policies. This was a busy year for Faculty Senate. There have been policy updates, department name changes, and much more. A successful initiative that I was able to be an advocate for was the option of Credit/No Credit. We were able to gather hundreds of responses from the campus community, create a resolution in support of it, and vocalize our support in the committee. The campus was able to offer ABC/NC for our students during the fall, spring, and summer.

Faculty Executive Committee

Purpose: The Executive Committee is a committee of the Faculty Senate responsible for setting the agenda of the Faculty Senate, among other duties. This is smaller committee comprised of specific administrators, department faculty, and Faculty Senate committee chairs. There is one student seat on this committee that is usually assigned to the ASI Vice President of Academic Affairs. Here I was also vocal on the topic of Credit/No Credit, as well as other topics that impact students.

Aquatics Center Advisory Committee

Purpose: The Committee addresses the goals and general direction of the Aquatic Center. The Advisory Committee will provide oversight and review of the Associated Students' management of the Aquatic Center.
