Student Success, Outcomes, and Retention Committee

On March 17, 2022, Bethany Penn was able to attend the meeting as my designee with notes as follows:

Due to Spring Break, there was a conflicting meeting for this month's SSOAR meeting. There were not enough members to approve the agenda. In light of this the meeting went over a few updates and concerns from present members (including myself) and concluded the meeting.

Updates from Student Success Center:

• I brought up issues students (including myself) have been having verifying subject matter competency. There seems to be confusion regarding how students can apply to verify course equivalency. I noted that I hadn't been aware that students outside of the liberal arts degree could even apply to verify subject matter competency instead of taking CSET's.

Important updates for students to be aware of:

- Credential candidates of all majors could have subject matter equivalencies through their undergrad coursework that would exempt them from taking some CSET's. They should message Ashley Ciraulo at aciraulo@csus.edu to ask for an equivalency appointment to avoid taking CSETs that have been obtained by coursework equivalency.
- The Credential department is not advertising this option for students and I have notified that this is a serious shortcoming by the department because CSETs cost time and money for students.
