Ed-equity Updates:

- Students that need help paying for fingerprinting should be directed to Karina at Ed equity
  - There are eligibility criteria that Ed equity can help them identify and apply for aid or a refund.
- Karina has a workshop for credential applicants
  - I have emailed Karina for the dates. I will update this information. You can direct students to contact Karina at figueroaramirez@csus.edu for more application help.

Updates from Co-chairs:

- Dean's award:
  - They are looking for one person from the dean's office and one person from the committee that votes to serve on the interview panel
    - The responsibilities will be:
      - Help conduct the interviews
      - Help decide who will be awarded
      - Draft letter of recommendation
- Outstanding graduate student award:
  - They are talking about expanding on the two questions to get to know the candidates better.
    - They are planning to follow up with the nominees to expand the application and ask for two letters of recommendation
    - Instead of a personal statement they will utilize a Qualtrics survey.
    - They will use the Qualtrics survey to fill out a rubric and it will narrow down to the interviewees
    - The survey will follow rubric specified questions so that there is order to the decision process.
    - The rubric comprises the priorities the panel finds in candidates such as their commitment to inclusion and passion for their field.
    - The committee felt the rubric was a positive contribution to the decision process to mitigate the difficulties deciding on the recipient between vastly different candidates. They are focusing on the rubric to narrow the applicants and using it as a tool to settle disputes between voting members.
