CARES Office Support for Students – Featured Area

The Crisis Assistant & Resource Education Support (CARES) office has a number of resources available to help our students during this unprecedented pandemic. While the office provides support for students in crisis or experiencing unique challenges to their education, I wanted to focus on their emergency services today. Below is a brief list of some of the resources available to our students who have emergency need:

Emergency Funds

Emergency grants are available to eligible students who have experienced a loss of income or added expenses because of the pandemic or are experiencing a one-time crisis that is financially affecting their education. Emergency Housing Support (short-term emergency housing)

This service offers up to 30 days of housing on campus for students experiencing a brief, unexpected housing crisis. Students will have weekly case management appointments to support them with establishing long-term housing. Student Affordable Housing (Rapid Rehousing)

Academic year-long support for students experiencing homelessness. Sac State Student Affordable Housing, or officially known as Rapid Rehousing (RRH) is reserved for students who are homeless (living in their cars, staying temporarily on a friend or relative's couch, or staying somewhere not normally meant for dwelling). This program is designed to quickly house a student whether or not they are able to pay rent or a deposit and support the student with a lease and affordable housing (\$400-\$500/month). This is a program (and includes case management services contracted by community agencies) to help a student stabilize their housing, academics, and holistic wellness.
