Report to the ASI Board of Directors April 22, 2020

University CFO Designee – Gina Curry

1. **Fall 2020 Registration** - Registration for Fall 2020 begins next Monday, April 27th. Please remind your constituents to check their accounts for Spring 2020 charges/holds **SEVERAL DAYS BEFORE** their registration date.
2. **Student Fee Advisory Committee** - The Student Fee Advisory Committee will conduct one virtual meeting in early May to discuss the fee audit and make recommendations. The audit report recommendations will be going to the President in mid-May. Thank you to student members Denisse Garcia, Jet Haresco, Deborah Ikenador, Nick Mahedy, and Christian Landaverde for their work on the Committee this year.
3. **Summer Session Campus Mandatory Fees** – The campus mandatory fees for summer have been reduced to a total of \$137. The Union/WELL fee was removed from the total, as the WELL will be shut down for the summer and the Union likely reducing services. The Student Health Center Operations and Facilities fees, in addition to the ASI fee, will still be charged.
4. **CARES Higher Education Grant** – The University has more than \$17 million dollars in Federal student stimulus monies to disburse. Campus administration is working very hard on a plan to provide those monies to student as quickly as possible. It is still being determined to who, and how much, will be disbursed to students. This stimulus money will not have an impact on either this year's or next year's financial aid package.
5. **COVID-19 Reduced Services** – Many in-person departments and services remain closed to in-person visits. Please check the department websites for more information about how to access help from those departments.
6. **UBAC** – The University Budget Advisory Committee has pushed its work out until May under uncertain economic information from the State. The University Divisions are working through 3% and 5% cut scenarios in expectation of reduced budget support from the State. The Chancellor's Office and the University are awaiting the State May budget revision (May Revise) for a starting point. The State is expected to revise budget allocations in August, after the State tax revenues are calculated following the July 15 tax deadline.
