## Legislation for Joint Council

- The SSIS Joint committee basically has no foundation and it difficult to maintain for next directors. To alleviate the barriers of trying to organize with SSIS clubs, I am in the process of writing legislation that makes a Joint Council an ASI Committee that each director must chair. I am open to any suggestions if joint councils interests you or if you are a director that is struggling to get their Joint Council off the ground.
- Once the joint council is in effect, I plan to schedule a virtual study time where we study for 45 mins and then take break for 15 minutes to discuss any interesting topics we are studying for at least 2 hours once a week.

## Legislation for three strikes policy

• In our ASCSUS OPERATING RULES, we have a "three strikes" policy. Not only is this policy punitive but it upholds institutionalized racism and ablism. The "three strikes law" in California has been proven to be rooted in racist criminalized language. It disproportionately effects brown and black by imposing a mandatory life sentence without parole on offenders convicted of certain crimes(most likely non-violent crimes). I believe this policy does not prevent Directors from committing an offense and only adds barriers to success. What constitutes as a strike is loosely outlined in the ASI operating rules leaving it up to the EVPs discretion. I am brainstorming a clearer outline of what constitutes a serious offense and hope to find a better way to "negatively" incentives a Director to fulfill their duties.
