## **ADMINSTRATION & DEPARTMENTS**

- ASI 2020-2021 Annual Budget was approved by the Board of Directors on April 14, 2020. The next step is meet with President Nelsen and share budget plans for the coming year.
- o I was invited to join the AOA Executive Committee for a two-year term. I will attending their Board meetings four times a year, starting with my first meeting last Friday.
- ASI FT staff is wrapping up its year-long Anti-Racism Workshops on April 23<sup>rd</sup>. It has been a year
  of learning and discussions facilitated by outside consultant Jermaine Moore. It has been a very
  positive experience received well by staff.
