Winter 2024 Data:

- 65% of eligible graduates RSVP'd to Winter Commencement
 - o 62% in attendance from the RSVP
- 23,583 guest tickets were claimed
 - o 42% of available tickets for guests
 - Many guest tickets were unclaimed

Spring 2025 Summary:

- Approx. 6,978 graduates
 - o Spring and Summer 2025 graduates
 - Will be monitoring students who "are set to graduate" in Fall 2025
- 7 GUEST TICKETS for each graduate

• GENERAL REGISTRATION is now OPEN!

- o March 3rd at 9am **April 24**th at **NOON**
- Late Registration is set to open from May 2nd May 17th
 - Check in is now required at G1C when you arrive
 - *Grad card will not be pre-printed for you*
 - Your name will not be pre-recorded, will be read aloud during the ceremony
- "Spring 2025 Commencement ceremonies are only for Spring 2025 and Summer 2025 graduates. If a graduate registers and claims guest tickets for Spring 2025 Commencement but later updates their expected graduation term to any term other than Spring or Summer 2025, their ceremony registration will be canceled, and their guest tickets will be invalidated. We are unable to accommodate any requests from Fall and Winter graduates to participate early or late in the Spring ceremonies."
 - o Graduates will be notified VIA email, or FAQ page on Commencement Website
 - Will be put on tickets as well ^^
 - O The reasoning is due to graduates taking advantage of this loophole which ultimately affects the ceremony schedule and guest ticket allotment

Approved Recommendations & Feedback (by the President):

- Recommendation #1: Ticketing Deadline/Extra Tickets
- The Commencement Office will assess the possibility of issuing extra tickets a few weeks before Commencement and will announce any updates at the appropriate time. Please note that if extra tickets are made available, the allocation may vary by ceremony, and in some cases, additional tickets may not be offered for all ceremonies.
 - o Arts & Letters: 13 guest tickets
 - o Business: 14 guest tickets



o ECS & NSM: 11 guest tickets

HHS: 7 guest ticketsSSIS: 8 guest ticketsEDU: 14 guest tickets

Concerns were mentioned about unfairness between the colleges based on ticket allotment, majority of committee approved this recommendation stating it would be *unfair* for those guest tickets to not be used.

Recommendation #2: Continue with Halftime Show?

• The Commencement Office will work with the Grad Jam MCs and KSSU to create a 2-minute remix for the G1C AV team to play during the halftime show of each ceremony. The same remix will be played at every halftime show.

• Recommendation #3: Streamer Cannons

- The Commencement Office will find the most cost-effective vendor to provide streamer cannons for each ceremony, set to go off during the turning of the tassels.
 - o Winter 2024: \$8,320 (for 3 ceremonies)
 - o Spring 2025: \$16,000 (estimated)

Recommendation #4: Contingency Plans

 President Wood supports schedule Option 2 of the Hornet Stadium contingency plan. The Event Center will only be considered if Hornet Stadium is unavailable.
