- ASI Scholarships awards were reported to Sac State Financial Aid Office. Congratulations to all
 of the scholarship recipients!
- Continue to have my 1:1 meetings with each of you sometimes multiple 1:1s as we discuss
 your future graduate school plans. Remember I am always happy to support your graduate
 school application efforts.

Department Highlights

- Business & Administration I have been working with Mark and HR to finalize the minimum wage increases that will take effect on January 1, 2023.
- o Children's Center Continues to serve children with 153 children currently enrolled.
- Student Engagement and Outreach I am proud to announce that this year SEO distributed over 200 Thanksgiving Food Baskets. 150 students received a food basket and a \$30 gift card to purchase a turkey. Successfully fundraised \$9,800 for this effort.
 - Specifically, the baskets distributed as follows:
 - 150 went to Sac State students
 - 50 full Thanksgiving food baskets went to Opening Door, an organization serving refugees resettling in Sacramento
- The food pantry had 1,557 visits in November- pantry closed during three days in November (Veteran's Day, Thanksgiving). We are seeing a steady increase in numbers month over month.
 As a reminder, October's numbers were 1,767 visits. September we had 1,923 visits.
- This past month I continued to meet with the Sacramento Food Bank to kick off a bi-weekly delivery of food purchased at wholesale prices, with an ETA start in the Spring.
- Peak Adventures- Continues to have a successful semester with a successful fall semester for fall trips and bike trips – great to see the Alternative Transportation Funds put to good use.
 We had a 92% go-rate for all scheduled trips.
- Government Office- Great work with your kick-off events, I am trying to visit them if time allows. Great work in the All Ears Event, very well executed. We are wrapping up the semester with our check-ins and finishing off strong.
- Aquatic Center Entering its quiet season. Hours have been shortened to reflect the season.
 They are working on submitting their Department of Boating and Waterways (DBAW) grant and Annual Report.
