FREE Bus & Lightrail with your OneCard

Sacramento Regional Transit (RT) services the Greater Sacramento Area and has several buses that arrive at and depart from Sac State throughout the day. Students may ride all RT fixed-route transit services, including light rail, by presenting a valid Sac State OneCard and the student commuter sleeve. It is \$40 for 6 months for Staff/Faculty.

To get your commuter sleeve:

- Visit the Bursar's Office in Lassen Hall
- Visit the UTAPS Office in the Welcome Center
- Order online to have it mailed. Log-in using your SacLink account, click on Get Permits and select the option for a commuter sleeve.

ASI Food Pantry

To be eligible, students must:

- 2. Bring One-Card
- 3. Bring reusable bag for items
- 4. Fill out the New User Registration Form (once a semester).

Safe Rides Program

Having car issues? Need a quick ride somewhere? Safe Ride's goal is to help reduce DUI incidents and provide safe transportation for students by giving financial reimbursement for rideshare trips. Sac State students can request up to \$40 cash back (until funds last) per semester for rides taken from rideshare services, taxis, and public transportation. For Fall 2022, the Safe Rides program allows students to claim cash back for SMOG checks, and vehicle safety inspection fees.
