With the exception of general formatting changes (such as font sizes), the candidate statements appear exactly as they were presented by the candidates. Any spelling or grammatical errors are the result of the respective author.

ASI VOTING DAYS & LOCATIONS

ONLINE VOTING

The easiest way to vote is to use your computer or personal device, as access will be continuous from April 6th, 8:00 a.m. until April 7th, 7:30 p.m.

CAMPUS POLLING LOCATION AND DAY(S)

An in-person polling station will be located in front of the University Union near the ATMs. Students will be able to cast their votes from this station.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. How do I know which candidates are running for office?

- a. Candidates' names were drawn during the ASI Ballot Draw held live on March 17th and are placed on the ASI website in the same order they will appear on the official ballot.

2. How do I vote?

- a. You can vote online at www.asi.csus.edu from any device with internet access from 8:00 a.m., Wednesday, April 6th, until 7:30 p.m., Thursday, April 7th. The online polls will be open continuously.

3. When can I get the election results?

- a. The election results will be announced at the ASI Elections Results Party, which will be held live in Riverview Hall, Elderberry & Beetle conference room beginning at 7:30 p.m. on Thursday, April 7th after the polls have been closed and total number of votes counted. You will also be able to find the results on the ASI Website here: www.asi.csus.edu.

4. What is the purpose of Cash for Clubs?

- a. The Cash for Clubs program of ASI is where clubs and organizations can receive funding in the Annual Elections. When students vote, they can also vote in favor of any one club/organization listed on the ballot. In turn, that club/organization receives \$5 for each vote received. A club/organization must have fulfilled the eligibility requirements in advance and be deemed eligible to be placed on the ballot. It is not necessary to be a member of the club to vote for the preferred club.

5. How does the election complaint process work?

- a. A complaint may be filed for a violation of any provision of the ASI Elections Code or the ASI Bylaws. A complaint may also be filed on any other grounds that allege that one or more candidate(s) or ballot measure(s) in an election was unfairly aided or hindered.

6. Time and Place For Filing of Complaints:

- a. Election complaints may be filed by any eligible voter. All complaints must be filed online via Hornet Hub no later than Thursday, April 14th, 2022, by 4:00 p.m. as well as submitting the required \$25 deposit, per filed complaint in person to the ASI Government Office (University Union, Room 3250)

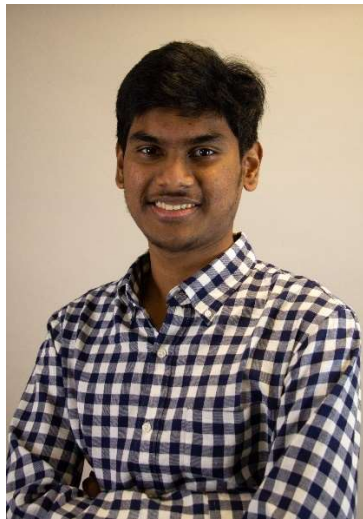

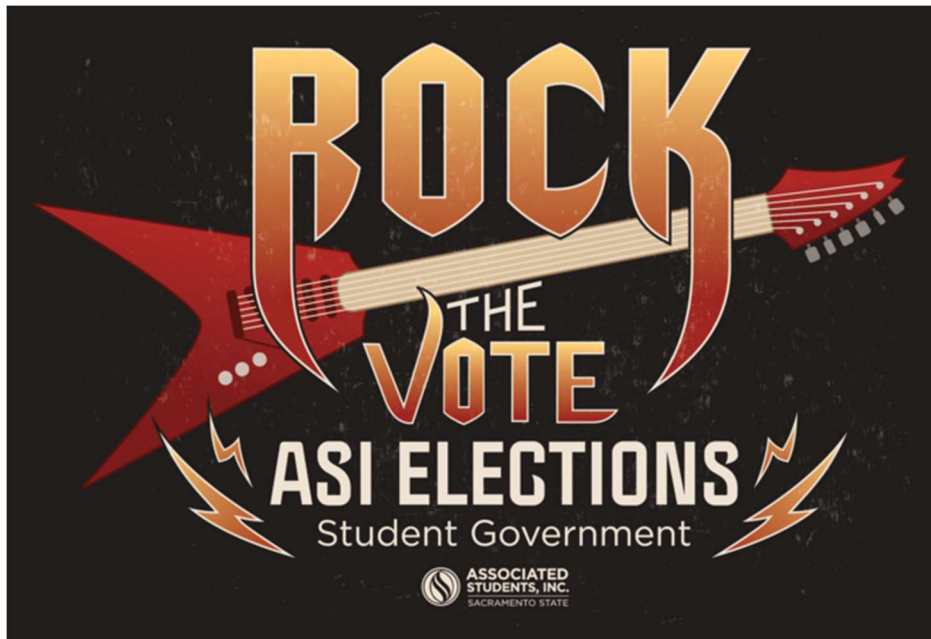
